Course Description

During this presentation, Robert Morgan will be describing the pathophysiology of hypothyroidism and the problems with using TSH levels to determine if the patient is a good candidate for therapy. He will describe the prevalence of iodine deficiency and how environmental factors have increased the prevalence of hypothyroidism. In addition, he will describe the evidence that supports supplementing T4 medication with T3 to help resolve patient symptoms and improve patient outcomes.
